WHEREAS, J. A. Quinn has conveyed to Greenville County all his right, title and interest in the right of way as presently constituted running across Lots 2 and 3.

All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, which Greenville County has in the right of way on Creole St., shown in Plat Book "A" at page 75, said right of way being 30 feet wide and commencing at the joint corner of Lots 3 and 4; Block "E", and running 150 feet to Bramlett Road; thence along Bramlett Road to corner of Lot No. 1, Block "A", thence along the line of Block "A", Lots 1 ~~and 2~~ to the intersection of Lots 1 and 2; thence along Creole Street to the point of beginning.
