known and designated as Lots 6 and 7 of the subdivision of the Buist property known as Oakland Heights, Block "B", as shown on a plat of said property recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, S. C. in Plat Book "F" at page 204 and being more particularly described as follows:-

Beginning 435 feet in an Easternly direction from Robinson Street on Mountain View Ave. joint corner of Lots 5 and 6 and running thence with Mountain View Avenue in an Easternly direction 200 feet to the joint corner of Lots 7 and 8; thence with the dividing line of Lots 7 and 8 in a Southernly direction 170 feet, six inches, to a stake on a 19 foot alley; thence with said alley in a Westernly direction 200 feet to the joint rear corner of Lots 5 and 6; thence with the line of Lots 5 and 6 in a Northernly direction 170 feet, six inches, to the joint corner of Lots 5 and 6 on Mountain View Avenue, the beginning corner.
