and in the City of Greenville, Ward 5, and having the following courses and distances:

Beginning at a point on Nichols Street 152 feet, more or less, from the southeast corner of Nichols and Anderson Streets, and running thence along the south side of Nichols Street in a southeasterly direction 62.2 feet to the corner of a lot now or formerly belonging to Crosby D'Oyley; thence in a southwesterly direction 134 feet to the joint corner of lots now or formerly belonging to Crosby D'Oyley, Henry Miles and Lula Patterson; thence in a northwesterly direction along the line of the lot now or formerly belonging to Henry Miles 63 feet to the joint corner of lots now or formerly belong to Miles, C. R. Bowen, and Olive Anderson; thence in a northeasterly direction along the line of lot now or formerly of Olive Anderson 126.3 feet to the beginning corner; and being Lot 5, Block 2, as shown on plat 86 of the City Block Book for the City of Greenville, S. C.

As a part of the consideration for this deed it is subject to the mortgage executed by J. Belton Calhoun to E. P. Hartsell and J. W. Davis, Executors, dated February 19, 1935, and recorded in Mortgage Book 246, page 254.

This is the same lot which was conveyed to J. Belton Calhoun by Mrs. A. C. Davis by her deed dated February 7, 1912, and recorded in Deed Book 172, page 395.

Said J. Belton Calhoun died intestate leaving as his sole heirs at law and distributees surviving him the following children, W. T. Calhoun, Robert Calhoun, D. C. Calhoun and J. Belton Calhoun, Jr., who became the sole owners of the said land upon the death of the said J. Belton Calhoun.
