

TITLE TO REAL ESTATE

THE STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA, } BY THE SECRETARY OF THE STATE.
EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, F. Scott Davenport, Sr. and F. Scott Davenport, Jr.,
both of Greenville, S. C.,

did on the 25th day of September, 1947, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is AMERICAN BUREAU

THIRD: That the principal place of business is P. O. Box 2234, Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is investigations and reporting for life and industrial insurance companies, and automobile, fire and casualty insurance companies. Making all types of investigations and credit reports for all types of insurance, etc. To receive and accept for liquidation notes and accounts due and owing professional men, merchants, hospitals and various classes of industry. Credit reporting and investigations of all kind and types.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is One Thousand (\$1,000.00)

payable \$100.00 in property; \$200.00 in services rendered and transfer of going concern; \$210.00 in money, subscribed; and \$490.00 to be issued.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is two thousand (2000) of the par value of Fifty cents (\$0.50)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 22nd day of September, 1947, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:

F. Scott Davenport, Sr. and F. Scott Davenport, Jr.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President F. Scott Davenport, Sr. as Vice-President, F. Scott Davenport, Jr.; as Secretary, F. Scott Davenport, Jr. as Treasurer, F. Scott Davenport, Sr.

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
