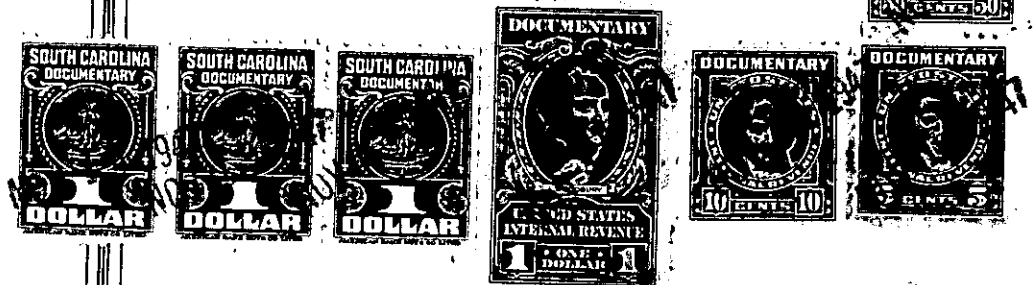

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents  
do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Hazle B. Cleveland her heirs and assigns  
forever;

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville  
County, State of South Carolina, in the City of Greenville, on the corner of  
Dunbar Street and Industrial College Street having the following metes  
and bounds:

Beginning at a point on Dunbar Street, corner of Lot now or  
formerly owned by D. W. Cochrane, Jr., and running thence along  
Dunbar Street in a westerly direction 27.4 ft., more or less, to  
intersection of Dunbar St. and Industrial College St.; thence in a  
southerly direction along Industrial College St., 100 ft. to corner
