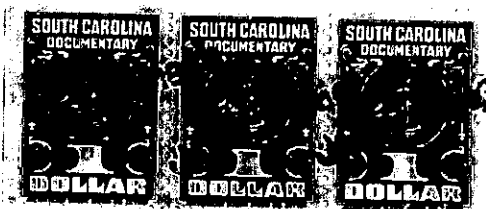
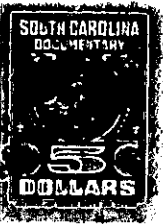

 do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said W. S. Hughey and Lala E. Hughey, and their  
Heirs and Assigns forever,

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Highland Township, Greenville  
 County, State of South Carolina, in Pleasant Hill School District, No. 13-F, lying  
 about one mile Northeast from Pleasant Hill School and Church and on  
 both sides of the road that leads from the Pleasant Hill Baptist Church  
 by the Pink Mill place, bounded on the Northeast by lands of Gordon  
 Moon, on the Southeast by lands of Edith Ross, on the South by Esther  
 Hart and H. L. Sudduth, and on the South and West by lands of H. L.  
 Sudduth and Pearl Stokes, and on the North by lands formerly owned by  
 J. M. Sudduth, having the following courses and distances, according to  
 plat made by J. H. Atkins, Surveyor:
