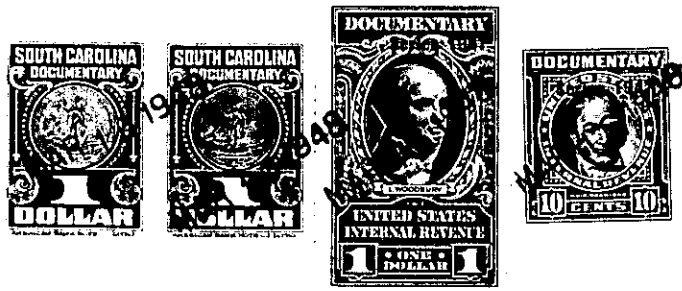

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said C. O. Brown, and Vivian W. Brown and their Heirs and Assigns forever,

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in \_\_\_\_\_ Township,  
County, State of South Carolina, lying about one mile west from the old City limits of Greer and on the south side of the old U. S. Highway No. 29, being all of Lot No. 79 on plat of property made for the Planters Savings Bank by H. S. Brockman, Surveyor, recorded in Plat Book "J", Pages 22 and 23, having the following courses and distances:

BEGINNING at a point or pin 70 feet east from intersection of Hunt Street and the old U. S. Highway (Poinsett Road), and runs thence with the common line of Lots 78 and 79 S. 12 W. 175 feet to a point or pin, joint corner of Lots 78 and 79, 106 and 107; thence S. 78 E. 70 feet to a point or pin; thence N. 12 E. 175 feet to a point or pin on the south side of said old Highway, joint corner of Lots 79 and 80; thence with the South side of old Highway or Poinsett Road N. 78 W. 70 feet to the beginning corner.
