KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That We, Leila J. Goldsmith, John H. Goldsmith,  
Cary J. Ryder, Lawrence Goldsmith, and Thomas F. Goldsmith,  
in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of  
Ten (\$10.00) Dollars  
to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents  
by Thomas L. Goldsmith,  
(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents  
do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Thomas L. Goldsmith,

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Bates Township, Greenville  
County, State of South Carolina having the following metes and bounds to wit;

Beginning at an iron pin in the middle of the Tubbs Mountain Road at corner  
of Q.A. Morrison property.. and running thence along the line of said Morrison  
property in a North Eastern direction 200 feet more or less to corner of Thos.  
L. Goldsmith property, thence along line of said Thomas L. Goldsmith property  
in a North Eastern direction 400 feet more or less to an iron pin in middle  
of Tubbs Mountain Road, thence along middle of said Road 400 feet more or less,  
to the beginning corner, and containing two Acres, more or less.
