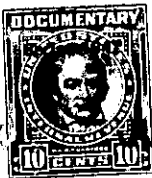

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said..... E. L. Davis, his heirs and assigns forever:

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville

County, State of South Carolina and in the City of Greenville, being known and designated as Lot No. 14 as shown on plat recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book "A", at page 155, and being more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at an iron pin on the south side of Stall street at the joint corner of Lots Nos. 14 and 15, which point is 100 feet west of the southwest corner of the intersection of Stall and Stratham street, and running thence along the joint line of said lots S. 3/4 W. 118 feet more or less, to an iron pin at the joint rear corner of said lots; thence N. 86 1/2 W. 50 feet, more or less, to an iron pin; thence N. 3/4 E. 118 feet more or less, to an iron pin on the south side of Stall street; thence along the south side of Stall street, S. 86 1/2 E. 50 feet, more or less, to the beginning corner.
