County, State of South Carolina, just outside of the City limits of the City of Greenville, located on the Buncombe Road and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a stake on Buncombe Road, in center of what was formerly lot No. 10 of lands of Mountain City Land and Improvement Company, and running thence N. 59 E., 54 feet to an angle; thence N. 74 E., 166 feet to a stake in center of former lot No. 10; thence S. 23-3/4 E., 22 feet to a stake OM; thence along line of property now or formerly of W. H. Taff, S. 66 W., 212 feet to a stake OM on Buncombe Road; thence with said Buncombe Road, 40 feet to the beginning corner.
