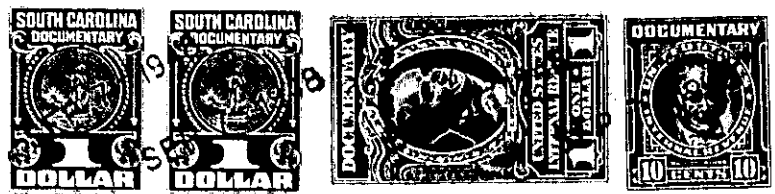

All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Chick Springs Township, Green-
ville County, State of South Carolina, in the city of Greer, lying on
the northwest side of Littlefield Street, being all of Lot No. 25 and
one half of Lot No. 26 as shown on plat of property of the Lida West-
woodland W. T. Walker property, plat recorded in Greenville County REC
office, and having the following courses and distances:

BEGINNING At a point on the west edge of Littlefield Street, being the
center of line of Lot No. 26, and being exactly fifteen feet from the
northeast corner of the William Tolliver Bramlett home lot, and runs
thence with the western edge of said Littlefield Street N. 32-10 E. 39
feet to a stake, common corner of Lots 24 and 25; then e with the com-
mon line of these lots N. 57-17 W. 125 feet to a stake, joint corner
of Lots 20, 21, 24 and 25; thence S. 32-10 W. 39 feet to a point, being
the center of the dividing line between Lots 22 and 26; thence along
the center line of Lot 26 S. 57-17 E. 125 feet to the beginning, and
being the identical property conveyed to grantor by William Tolliver
Bramlett by deed dated December 11, 1947, and recorded in Deed Book
No. 256, at page 98 thereof.
