CHARTER BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS,

C. HEYWARD MORGAN and A.F. BURGESS,

both of Greenville, S.C.,

FILED GREENVILLE CO. S.C.

SEP 17 10 43 AM 1948

did on the 14th day of September, 1948, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is PLAZA THEATRE, INC.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to own, operate, control and maintain moving picture theatres and other entertainment and places of entertainment, amusement and recreation; to buy and sell real estate and property of all descriptions; and otherwise to do any and all things corporations of this State by law are permitted to do.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Sixty Thousand (\$60,000.00) - - - - - Dollars payable in cash or its equivalent at the call of the Directors.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is six hundred (600) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) - - - - - Dollars.

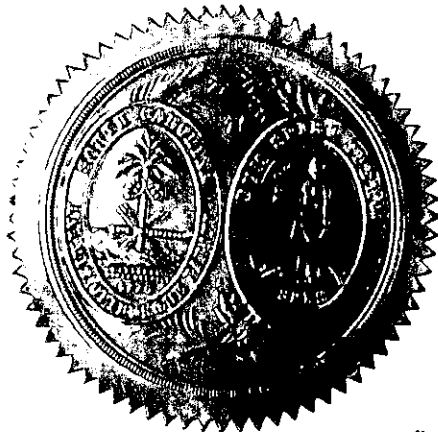
SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 4th day of September, 1948, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: C. Heyward Morgan, Ethel M. Morgan, S.D. Mitchell, Edgar M. Norris, R.S. Small, James M. Bruce and A.F. Burgess

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President, C. Heyward Morgan ; as Vice-President, Ethel M. Morgan ; as Secretary, S.D. Mitchell ; as Treasurer, C. Heyward Morgan

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Piedmont a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the afore-said Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
