"All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in Dunklin Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, on Mountain Creek, waters of Saluda River, containing 100 acres, more or less, and having according to a survey made by William F. Lee, May 1, 1919, the following metes and bounds, courses and distances, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a stone 3x in the field and running thence S. 83 W. 30 chains to a stone 3x; thence S. 7 E. 8.30 chains to a stone 3x; thence S. 46-1/2 E. 36.50 chains to a stone 3x; thence S. 87-1/2 E. 18 chains to a stone 3x by a Sweet Gum OM; thence N. 21-1/2 W. 41 chains to the beginning corner, being the same tract of land conveyed to Thomas Oliver Cooley by Emily E.
