KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That Maude C. Robinson, Shirley L. Robinson, Lula R. Heaton, Jess Robinson, Hassie E. Robinson, Arthur G. Robinson, George B. Robinson, Hubert Robinson, and Leola R. Leister

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Thirty-five Hundred (\$3500.00) Dollars

to US in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by R. W. Robinson

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said R. W. Robinson

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Paris Mountain Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, adjoining lands of myself and W. W. Robinson,

BEGINNING on a black Gum, thence running S. 13 1/2 W. 9.54 to an iron pin on the Parker Road, thence with said road N. 3 1/2 W. 5.20 to the fork of Road, thence with another Road N. 42 E. 1.75 to a bend in Road, thence N. 20 E. 3.12 to an iron pin in said Road; thence S. 63 1/2 E. 40 links to the beginning corner and contains .87 acres more or less.

Being the same tract of land conveyed to W. W. Robinson by P. E. Hudson by deed dated February 2, 1924 and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Vol. 82 at page 414.

ALSO:

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, situate, lying and being in said County and State, in Paris Mountain Township, about six miles from Greenville Court House, on the Parker Road:

BEGINNING at a stone on P. E. Hudson's corner and running thence S. 33 W. 4.13 chains to a stone; thence S. 83 1/4 W. 9.27 chains to a stone; thence N. 13.10 E. 9.60 chains to a black gum; thence S. 64 E. 10.65 chains to the beginning corner, containing 6.43 acres, more or less, and being parcel # 2.
