Comes the plaintiff and files affidavit of non military service as follows (H.I.) and comes the prosecuting attorney and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court by the proof of publication filed herein as follows: (H.I.), that the defendant had due notice of the filing and pendency of this action by three successive weekly publications in the West Side Messenger a newspaper of general circulation, printed and published in the English language in Marion County, Indiana, the last of which publications was made more than thirty days prior to the return day thereof.

And the defendant being three times loudly called comes not, but makes default herein.

And this cause is now submitted to the court for trial, and the evidence being heard and the court being duly advised in the premises finds: For the plaintiff upon his complaint, that the material allegations of his complaint are true, and that he is entitled to an absolute divorce from the defendant upon the grounds alleged in his complaint. The court further finds that the plaintiff is prohibited from re-marrying for a period of two years, from this date.

IT IS THEREFORE CONSIDERED, ORDERED ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COURT that the bonds of matrimony heretofore existing between the plaintiff and defendant be set aside and dissolved, that the plaintiff Marion Calvin Forrester, be and he is hereby granted an absolute divorce from the defendant Sarah Louis Forrester, and that the plaintiff be and he is prohibited from re-marrying for a period of two years, and that the plaintiff pay the cost of this action taxed at \$\_\_\_\_\_.
