All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State

of South Carolina, and in the City of Greenville on the West side of Queen Street and the North side of Pack Street (or alley) and shown as Lot 6 in Block 9 on Sheet 123 on the County Tax Plat on file in the Auditor's Office for said Greenville County.

This is the same land heretofore conveyed to A. C. Davis by three deeds, recorded in R. M. C. Office for said Greenville County, as follows:

- (1) Deed from Charley Poor in Deed Book 4, Page 172;
- (2) Deed from Ellen Cannon in Deed Book 4, Page 69;
