**CHARTER**  
 BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS,

LILLIAN HARRISON and MARY C. TEMPLETON,

both of Greenville, S.C.,

did on the 6th day of April, 1949, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is ROBERT F. COLEMAN OF SOUTH CAROLINA, INC.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is

to engage in and carry on an insurance brokerage business, and to act as brokers, agents, managers and adjusters in the business of any kind or class of insurance, in any and all its branches; to procure upon commission or otherwise for corporations, firms or individuals engaged in the insurance business of any kind, applications for insurance, opportunities to insure or to assume risks and such other business as such corporations, firms or individuals shall desire or shall be authorized to transact; to procure upon commission or otherwise for corporations, firms or individuals desiring insurance of any kind, or the assumption of risk by a corporation, firm or individual, such insurance or assumption of risk by a corporation, firm or individual having power and authority to engage in such business; to act as agent, representative, solicitor or collector for any corporation, firm or individual engaged in insurance business of any kind or in any other business, in such manner and to such extent as may be lawful for a corporation organized under the laws of South Carolina and to engage in all business relating to or connected with insurance of any kind or character to any extent that is lawful and proper for a corporation not organized under the Insurance Laws of the State of South Carolina, or permitted to transact business as an insurer under said laws; to organize, systematize and manage the business of corporations, firms and individuals in so far as it relates to insurance and insurable hazards of every kind and description; to negotiate and make, as broker or agent, but not as an insurer, agreements and contracts relating to the making, taking or placing of insurance of any kind.

The foregoing enumeration of specific powers shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner, the general powers of the corporation, and the enjoyment thereof, as conferred by the Laws of the State of South Carolina.
