

(2) Also all the rights, privileges and easements (except and excluding those affecting and relating to three parcels of land hereinafter described and numbered (1), (2) and (3) below) relating to the transmission of electricity, the location of electric transmission poles and the maintenance of said electrical system that were conveyed to the said Blackinton Mills, Inc. by deed of W. M. Shelton and Henry P. Willimon, dated March 6, 1946 and filed in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, S. C. on March 8, 1946 in Deed Book 288 at page 296.

AND for the consideration above set out, the said Blackinton Mills, Inc. does hereby grant, sell and convey to the said Duke Power Company, its successors and assigns, the right, privilege and easement to construct, operate and maintain an electric transmission system, including the location and relocation of necessary power poles and other equipment across the following described tracts of land, to-wit:

(1) Tract of land lying on both sides of Reedy River, lying North and Northwest of Main Street, in the village of Conestee, on which there is located the mill building, warehouse, power plant and the Conestee Lake, all being shown on plat made by Dalton & Neves, Engineers, February 1946, and recorded in the R. M. C. office of Greenville County, S. C. in Plat Book "P" at page 9.

(2) Tract of land situated at corner of Main Street and Third Street, in the village of Conestee on which there is located the water tank and being designated as Lot 152 on Plat of Conestee, made by R. E. Dalton, Engineer, December 1943, revised February 1946, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Plat Book "K" at page 276.

(3) That tract of land on the Southeast side of Fourth Street in the village of Conestee, designated as Lot 153 on Plat of Conestee, made by R. E. Dalton, Engineer, December 1943, revised February 1946, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Plat Book "K" at page 276.
