

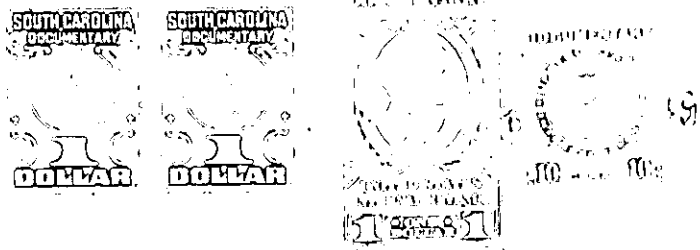

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Highland Township, Greenville  
County, State of South Carolina, located on the South side of Campobello-  
Cockrell Bridge highway, about 12 miles North of Greer, S. C.  
and about 5 1/2 miles Southwest of Campobello, S. C.

Beginning at a stone (R. O. gone) and runs thence N. 1.15 W.  
266 feet to a point in said road (stone gone); thence with the  
North edge of said road S. 62.00 W. 429 feet to a stake on North
