presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Frank G. Bridwell
and assigns forever

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Cineal Township, Greenville
County, State of South Carolina, about three miles north of Greenville, lying
on the western side of the Mosteller Road (now State Highway
No. 14), being a part of the same land that was conveyed to
me by deed from Earl Southern February 10th 1938 and recorded
in the office of the R. M. J. for Greenville County in Deed
Book 136 at page 169, and having the following corners and
distances, to wit:-
