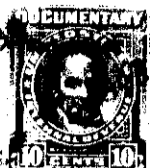
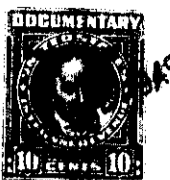
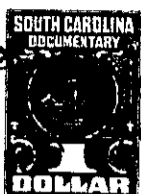

presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Grover C. Bramlett, his heirs
and assigns forever:-

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in O'Neal Township, Greenville
County, State of South Carolina, lying on the East side of the Cr. Creek Road,
about seven miles north of Greer, bounded by lands of J. C. L. Bramlett on the North and East; by lands of J. H. Barton on the
South, and by said road and lands of Carl Poole on the West, and
having the following courses and distances, to-wit:-
