Green by H.L. Dunahoo, Surveyor, dated June 2, 1947, and recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book B, at page 108, and having the following courses and distances: BEGINNING at a stake on the West edge of said State Highway No. 14, the joint corner of lots Nos. 1 and 2 on said plat, and runs thence with the west edge of said State Highway N. 23.45 W. 125 feet to a point; thence a new line dividing lot No. 4 and running in a westerly direction 150 feet to a stake on the rear line of lot No. 17; thence S. 23.45 E. 125 feet to a stake, corner of lot No. 1 and on line of lot No. 19; thence with the common line of lots Nos. 1 and 2 in an easterly direction 150 feet to the beginning corner.
