in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Roy Dryman and J. L. Jewell, their heirs and assigns forever:

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, near the Farmers Oil Mill, about 2½ miles from Greenville Court House, on the White Horse Road, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a stone 3xm and running thence S. 55½ W. 3.60 chains to an iron pin on the White Horse Road 3xm; thence N. 6 E. 2.40 chains up said road to a bend in said road; thence N. 58½ E. 2.02 chains up said road to a stone 3xm in said road; thence S. 36 ¾ E. 1.76 chains to the beginning corner, containing one-half of one acre, more or less, adjoining lands now or formerly of W. H. Barton and others.
