WHEREAS, heretofore, our Father John H. Arnett departed this life leaving of force his last Will and Testament, which has been lodged and proven in the Probate Court for Greenville County, South Carolina, and may be found in Apartment 280 File 14; that by said Will he left his estate to his wife, who is our Mother, for and during her natural life and at her death it shall go to we three daughters, and if any of us predecease our Mother, then our share goes to the children of such deceased; but if dying and leaving no children, then such share to go to the survivors;

That before his death, our said Father, made and executed to Mr. L. O. Patterson his note for \$650.00 and secured the payment thereof by giving a mortgage on his real estate; that said mortgage was duly recorded in the proper office for Greenville County, said State, in mortgage Book 87 page 82; that no part of said note and mortgage has been paid; that in order to keep and preserve a home for our Mother, who is the widow of the said John H. Arnette, our Father, one of the three named as remaindermen in said Will, to wit: Bessie Arnette, now Bessie Goldsmith, paid the money to the holder of said note and mortgage and had it assigned to her and she is now the legal owner and holder of same; that said note and mortgage has never been proven as a claim against the estate of our Father and in order that the holder thereof may be held harmless, we do hereby admit the same to be a just and valid claim against his said estate and agree that the same may be paid and discharged after the death of our said Mother and that same may be now filed as such claim
