To All Whom These Presents Shall Come:

I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County aforesaid, SEND GREETING:

WHEREAS, J. B. Clark, Throma C. Parsons, and Juanita Clark,

on or about the 4th day of April in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and fifty exhibited their complaint in the County Court of Greenville County for the County aforesaid, against Marvin L. Clark

demanding relief as to the real estate described in the complaint: and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 20th day of April 1950, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a decree of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, be conveyed by E. INMAN, Master in and for the County aforesaid, to Marvin L. Clark for the purposes mentioned in the said decree, as by reference thereto on file in said Court, will appear; (See Judgment Roll No. F-405-----)

NOW, Therefore, Know all Men by these Presents, that I, E. INMAN, Master, in and for the County of Greenville aforesaid, by virtue of the aforesaid decree,

HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these presents, DO GRANT, convey and release unto the said Marvin L. Clark

"All that certain parcel and tract of land situate, lying and being on the North side of the New Highway, and on the West side of the Ragsdale land, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin at the bridge, joint corners of this tract and the tract awarded to Throma C. Parsons, and running thence with the center of the New Highway S. 86-15 W. 16.70 chs. to an iron pin; thence N. 40 W. 2.69 chs. to an iron pin; thence S. 4 E. 4.81 chs, to an iron pin, joint corners of this tract and the tract awarded to J. B. Clark; thence N. 85-1/2 E. 2.83 chs. to a pine; thence N. 85 E. 1.90 chs. to an iron pin; thence N. 78 E. 3.18 chs. to a pine; thence S. 81 E. 1.79 chs. to a poplar on branch; thence down the branch as a line between this tract and the Ragsdale property to the beginning corner, and containing 14.31 acres, more or less, as shown by plat and survey by Dean C. Edens, C. E., March, 18, 1950.
