I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County aforesaid, SEND GREETING:

WHEREAS, Hollis Bowers, Individually and as Executor of the Last Will  
and Testament of J. M. Bowers, deceased, et al

on or about the 6th day of May in the year of  
our Lord nineteen hundred and fifty exhibited their  
complaint in the County Court of Greenville, for the County aforesaid, against  
Nelson Bowers

demanding relief as to the real estate described in the complaint: and the cause being at issue, came on to  
be heard on the 17th day of May 19 50  
and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a decree of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged  
and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, be conveyed by E. INMAN,  
Master in and for the County aforesaid, to M. H. Sudduth and J. D. Plumley  
for the purposes mentioned in the said decree, as by reference thereto on file in said Court, will appear;

NOW, Therefore, Know all Men by these Presents, that I, E. INMAN, Master, in and for the County  
of Greenville aforesaid, by virtue of the aforesaid decree, and upon receipt of \$750.00

HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these presents, DO GRANT, convey and release  
unto the said M. H. Sudduth and J. D. Plumley,

"All that piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being  
in Glassy Mountain Township, Greenville County, South Carolina, on  
the South side of Morgan's Creek of sink hole fork of Tyger River,  
known as the Rebecca Bower's Place, and being more fully described  
as follows:

BEGINNING on a pile of rocks near the Mill Road, thence on the  
old line to a dogwood, thence running the old line to a stake; thence  
the old line to the Mill Road; thence the Mill Road to the pile of  
rocks, the beginning corner, containing fifty (50) acres, more or  
less, and bounded by lands now or formerly owned by Isack Ballew,  
Martha Plumley, Andrew Miller and others. Being the same tract  
conveyed to Rebecca Bowers by her father, Jacob Ballew, by his deed  
dated July 15, 1864.
