Also, all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Glassy Mountain Township, on both sides of Ballews Creek, waters of South Pacolet River, containing 40 acres, more or less, being the same land conveyed to John L. Pierce by Portman Howard, et al, by deed recorded in Deed Book 24, page 528, to which reference is made for a more specific description, the metes and bounds thereof being adopted and incorporated as a part of this deed.
