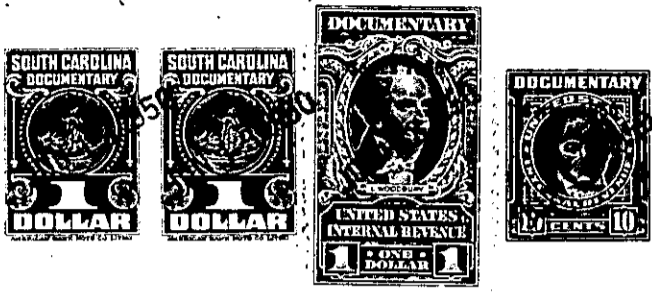

County, State of South Carolina, on the Northwest side of Hallton Road, and being known and designated as lot No. 8 of a subdivision known as Happy Valley Farms, as shown on plat made in July, 1944 by Dalton & Neves, Engrs., and recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Plat Book O, at page 103 and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the Northwest side of Hallton Road at the corner of Lot No. 9, which point is 347.5 feet Northeast of the intersection of said Hallton with a county road, and running thence along the line of said Lot No. 9, N. 56-30 W. 258.8 feet to an iron pin at the rear corner of said Lot No. 9; thence along the line of said Lot No. 7, S. 56-30 E. 259.4 feet to an iron pin at the corner of said lot on the Northwest side of Hallton Road; thence along the line of said Hallton Road, S. 33-22 W. 200 feet to the beginning corner.
