did on the 18th day of September 1951, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is COTAHAY DRUG STORE

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which he may conduct is to own and operate retail drug stores and to do all things incident to the operation of such business.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Twenty-five Thousand (\$25,000.00) - - Dollars payable in cash.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Two Hundred and Fifty (250) of the par value of One Hundred (.100.00) - - - - - Dollars.



NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 10 of the Constitution of South Carolina, 1912, and all amendments thereto be, and the same are hereby, repealed; and that the same shall not be construed as applying to any bona fide subscription or payment of the debts and obligations of the State, or any of its political subdivisions, or of the incorporated towns, of the State, or of the several counties of South Carolina.
