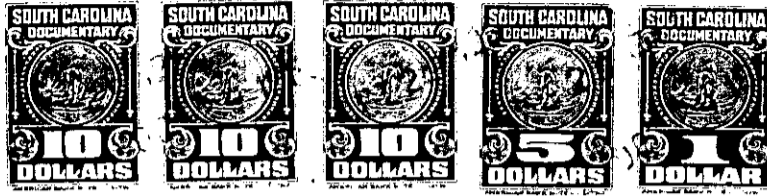

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, Edith Lang Gorman Bobo,

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Eighteen Thousand & No/100  
.. (\$18,000.00) -----Dollars

to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents  
by Sarah Allen and Cecilia Allen Glickman

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these  
presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Sarah Allen and Cecilia Allen  
Glickman, their heirs and assigns,

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville

County, State of South Carolina, with buildings and improvements thereon, being  
known and designated as Lot No. 14, as shown on plat recorded in the  
office of the R. M. C. for Greenville County in Plat Book "A" at  
page 878, fronting on Pendleton Street, West Greenville, and being  
described as follows:

BEGINNING On Pendleton Street, joint corner of Lots Nos. 14  
and 15, running thence with line of Lot No. 15, N. 13.15 E. 131.2  
feet to Bran-wood Street; thence with Bran-wood Street, N. 74.20 W.  
39.5 feet to corner of Lot No. 13; thence with line of Lot No. 13,  
S. 13.15 W. 124 feet to Pendleton Street; thence with Pendleton  
Street, S. 64.00 E. 40 feet to the point of beginning.

Being the same conveyed to my grandfather, J. A. Lang, by J. O.  
Raines by deed dated April 18, 1928, and recorded in the Office of  
the R. M. C. for Greenville County in Deed Book 143, at page 195.  
The said J. A. Lang died testate on August 26, 1930, being then a  
citizen and resident of Cataba County, North Carolina, leaving of  
force his last will and testament dated July 19, 1930, which was  
filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Superior Court of Cataba  
County, North Carolina, on September 8, 1930. A duly authenticated  
copy of the will and probate proceedings was filed in the Office of  
the Probate Court for Greenville County on December \_\_\_\_\_, 1930, in  
Apartment 267, File 34. By the terms of Item III of said will, my  
grandfather, J. A. Lang, deceased, willed, devised and bequeathed the  
above described property to his daughter, Evelyn L. Hawkins, for life  
and after her death to her children then living and those that may  
thereafter be born to her. My mother, Evelyn L. Hawkins, died in-  
testate on January 13, 1950, being then a citizen and resident of  
Greenville County, South Carolina, She was twice married, once to  
John Ernest Gorman and there was one child born of said wedlock,  
to-wit, myself, Edith Lang Gorman Bobo. Subsequent to the death of  
my father, John Ernest Gorman, my mother married J. R. Hawkins  
and they lived together as husband and wife until her death on  
January 13, 1950. There were no children born of the marriage of my
