CHARTER  
BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS, J. A. HENRY AND MARGARET WILSON JAN 21 11 11 AM 1952  
both of Greenville South Carolina OLLIE FARRSWORTH

did on the 14th. day of January, 1952, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration,  
signed by themselves, setting forth:

- FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
- SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is SUNDIAL FASHIONS, INC.
- THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S. C.
- FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is

To manufacture, import, export, buy, sell, exchange  
and distribute ladies' and men's dresses, sportwear and  
other apparel.

To import, export, buy and sell piece goods, fabrics  
and materials of all kinds for the manufacture of women's and Men's  
wearing apparel and sportwear.

To carry on any other manufacturing business which can  
conveniently be carried on in connection with or incidental  
to any of the aforesaid operations.

To take, buy, exchange, lease or otherwise acquire  
real estate and any interest or right therein, and to hold,  
own, operate, control, maintain, manage and develop the  
same and to construct, alter, manage and control, directly  
and through ownership of stock in any other corporations,  
any and all kinds of buildings, stores, offices, warehouses,  
mills, shops, factories, machinery and plants and any and  
all other structures and erections which may at any time be  
necessary, useful or advantageous for the purposes of this  
corporation.

To purchase, exchange, hire or otherwise acquire such  
personal property, chattels, rights, easements, permits,  
privileges and franchises as may lawfully be purchases,  
exchanged, hired or acquired under Article 2 of the Stock  
Corporation Law of the State of New York.

To purchase, acquire, hold, sell assign, transfer,  
mortgage, pledge and otherwise dispose of the shares of  
capital stock, bonds, debentures or other evidence of  
indebtedness of any corporation, domestic or foreign,  
and while the holders thereof, to exercise all the rights  
and privileges of ownership, including the right to vote  
thereon, and to issue in exchange therefor its own stock,  
bonds and other obligations.

The Corporation, may, by resolution of its Board of Directors,  
guarantee any obligation for the payment of money made  
in connection with and incidental to the exercise by the  
corporation of its corporate rights, powers, purposes,  
privileges and franchises, or the negotiation by  
the corporation by sale or otherwise of any obligation owned  
by it.

To do all such acts and things as are incidental or  
conducive to the premises.
