BEGINNING at the northwest corner of Nichols Street, and Green Avenue, thence running along Green Avenue northeasterly 52 feet to Frank Whiter corner on Green Avenue, thence with Frank Whiter line, westerly 94 feet, more or less, to a pin; thence southeasterly 56 feet to a point on Nichols Street, thence along Nichols Street about 86 feet to the corner of Green Avenue and Nichols Street, the beginning corner, being the same property deeded to J.
