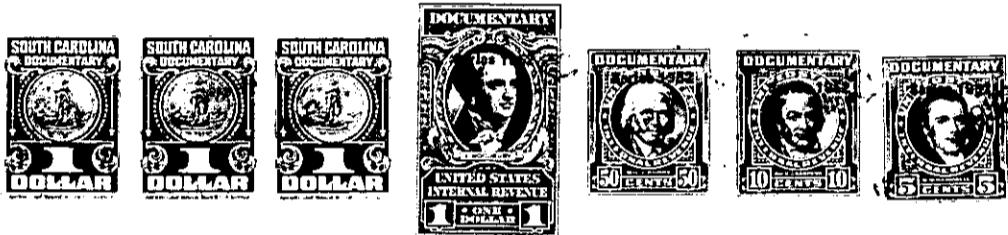

to the grantor(s) in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by the grantee(s) (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Clint J. Ballaw, and Gladys L. Ballew

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being on the South side of Blue Ridge Drive near the city of Greenville, and being known and designated as Lot Number One of the property of Leo G. Ballenger according to a plat made by Dalton and Neves, February 1952, and according to said plat being more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the South side of Blue Ridge Drive and running along Blue Ridge Drive, N. 84-0 E. 60 ft. to an iron pin at the corner of lot number 2; thence along the line of lot number 2, S. 6-13 E. 180 ft. to an iron pin; thence S. 84-0 W. 60 ft. to an iron pin; thence N. 6-13 W. 180 ft. to an iron pin and the beginning corner.
