CHARTER
BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS,

Harry B. Davis and Thomas A. McCarthy, both of
160 Broadway, New York, N.Y.,

did on the 7th. day of March, 1952, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration,
signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is GREENVILLE LINING CORPORATION

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is To manufacture, buy, sell and
deal in cut linings used in shirts, sport shirts, pajamas and other articles of
apparel; to buy, sell, export, import and generally deal in textiles of all kinds
and personal property generally.

To borrow money for corporate purposes; to own, buy, acquire, sell, convey,
lease, mortgage, rent, control, operate and deal in real estate and buildings of
all kinds wherever the interests of the corporation may be concerned or prompted,
the foregoing purposes being in addition to the general powers conferred on cor-
porations by the laws of South Carolina and not in limitation thereof.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is One Thousand (\$1,000.00)----- Dollars
payable in full.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is one thousand (1,000)
of the par value of One (\$1.00) ----- Dollars each,
and each shareholder shall be entitled to cast one vote for each share of stock
standing in his name at any meeting of the stockholders of the corporation.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 26th. day of
February, 1952, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the follow-
ing were elected directors: Herbert Haskell, Sam R. Dubin and Thomas A. McCarthy.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President, Herbert Haskell ;
as Vice-President, ; as Secretary, Sam R. Dubin ;
as Treasurer, Sam R. Dubin.

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1942, and all amendments
thereto have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by
bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice
of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville News
a newspaper published in the County of Greenville.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, O. FRANK THORNTON, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the afore-
said Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of
South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to
commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the
Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
