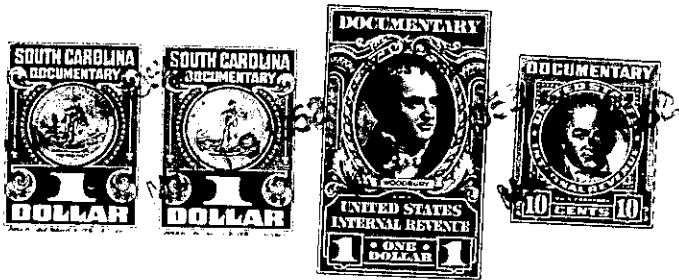

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS. That I, Julia Bell Singleton

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Five hundred Fifty (\$550.00)

to me..... in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents
by Robert L. Smith

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these
presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Robert L. Smith, his heirs...
and assigns

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville
County, State of South Carolina on the south side of Piney Mountain, about
4 miles from the Greenville County Courthouse, being designated as
Lot. No. 4 on Plat of property of C.E. Singleton, recorded in the
R.M. Office for Greenville County, S.C., in Plat Book "V", Page 85,
and according to said plat having the following metes and bounds,
to-wit:

BEGINNING at a point on Singleton Road and thence along said road
N. 67-33 E. 101.7 feet to the joint corner of Lots 3 and 4; thence
along the joint line of Lots 3 and 4, S. 32-10 E. 330 feet to a
point joint corner of Lots 3 and 4; thence S. 45-35 W. 95 feet;
thence N. 32-30 W. 368 feet to the beginning corner.

This conveyance is subject to the following restrictions, to-wit:

1. Any residence constructed on said property shall be of substantial modern size and construction.
2. Septic tanks are permitted, but no outside toilets under any condition.
3. Property shall be used for residence only, and no kind or type of business activity shall be carried on.
