EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS,

T. A. Little, F. H. Beddingfield, and S. W. Craver

of Charlotte, N. C., and Edwin Pettett and Mrs. Alma R. Wynne of
Greenville, S. C.

did on the 20th. day of September, 1952, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration,
signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is AUGUSTA ROAD DRIVE-IN THEATRE
CORPORATION

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is

to engage in the general entertainment, motion picture, talking picture, drive-in, and vaudeville theatre business, including, buying, selling, renting and handling in any manner whatever of any and all items or kinds of equipment, service, and supplies that are in any degree or manner connected with or related to the operation of any kind of entertainment, show or theatre; that is to own, lease, and manage establishments or enterprises for the purpose of offering and furnishing to the public for compensation or otherwise, motion picture, talking picture, vaudeville or any other form of entertainment, or any item or kind of equipment, service, or supplies that are in any degree or manner connected with show or theatre; to conduct all or any such business or enterprises upon whatever terms and at whatever rates the company wishes, with a right and power to act either as an agent or as a principal with the authority to buy and sell anything whatever and with the privilege of conducting business in Greenville, South Carolina, or any city or cities whatever.

And in order properly to prosecute the objects and purposes above set forth, the corporation shall have full power and authority to purchase, lease and otherwise dispose of all kinds of property, both real and personal, both in this state and in all other States, Territories and dependencies of the United States; to purchase the business, good will and all other property of any individual, firm or corporation, as a going concern, and to assume all its debts, contracts and obligations, provided said business is not prohibited by the powers contained herein; to construct, equip and maintain buildings, works, factories and plants; to install, maintain and operate all kinds of machinery and appliances; to operate same by hand, steam, water, electric or other motive power, and generally to perform all acts which may be deemed necessary or expedient for the proper and successful prosecution of the objects and purposes for which the corporation is created.
