CHARTER 200

BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS, EMIL V. WILSON AND WESLEY L. WALKER

both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 26th. day of September, 1952, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is SUPERBA MANUFACTURING COMPANY

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to engage in a general manufacturing business and to buy raw goods for manufacture; to process such goods by bleaching and otherwise; to manufacture towels and cloth goods; to lease, buy and sell real estate and to do all things necessary and incidental to engaging in the manufacture and sale of cloth goods and other kindred lines; to engage in the manufacture, processing and sale of textiles of various and sundry kinds.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is One Hundred & Thirty Thousand Dollars / (\$130,000.00) payable Fifty Thousand Dollars in cash or its equivalent and the balance subscribed and payable on call.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Thirteen Hundred (1,300) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) - - - - - Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 17th. day of September, 1952 at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: Stuart C. Whiteside, Emil V. Wilson, Frank C. Bowers, and Wesley L. Walker

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President, Stuart C. Whiteside; as Vice-President, Emil V. Wilson; as Secretary, Emil V. Wilson; as Treasurer, Frank C. Bowers

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1942, and all amendments thereto have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Piedmont

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, O. FRANK THORNTON, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
