

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS That we, The First National Bank of Greenville,  
S. C., as Executor under the will of W. C. Cleveland, deceased,  
a corporation chartered under the laws of the State of United States of America

and having its principal place of business at Greenville in the State of South Carolina  
and Alice Burnett Cleveland as Executrix under the will of W. C.  
W. C. Cleveland, deceased, for and in consideration of the

sum of Twenty-Two Thousand Five Hundred and No/100 - - - - - - - - - - - - -

to it in hand duly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents by the grantee(s) hereinafter named, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto Catherine M. Beattie, her heirs and assigns, forever:

All those lots of land situate on the Southwest side of a road in the City of Greenville, Greenville County, S. C., and being the same as Lots 1, 2, 3, & 4, on a plat of Boxwoca Manor, made by Walter Lewis, Engineer, October, 1952, recorded in the R. & S. Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Plat Book "B3", page 10, and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the Southwest side of Woodlawn Way at joint corner of Lot 1 and property of Nellie M. Griffin and running the same in the line of the Griffin property S. 61-00 W. 3'0 foot to an iron pin on the Northeast side of Hemlock Drive; thence with the Northeast line of Hemlock Drive S. 29-08 E. 484.8 feet to an iron pin on the Northwest line of Woodlawn Way; thence with the North side " " " along S. 22-00 E. 130.3 feet to an iron pin; thence still with the line " " " N. 7 E. 168.8 feet to an iron pin at a bend in Woodlawn Way; thence still with Woodlawn Way N. 32-30 E. 161.7 feet to an iron pin; thence with the line with Woodlawn Way N. 23-00 W. 344.81 feet to the beginning point.

This is a portion of the property that was owned by W. A. Loveland at the time of his death on August 26, 1846, and this claim was made by the grantors, as Executors under the will of W. A. Loveland, against the power and authority conferred on us by his will dated June 10, 1846, in file in the Probate Court for Greenville County, S. C., in Cause No. 1, File 29.

For restrictions applicable to recorded water and sewer easements and to sewer, drainage and utility easements affecting lots in Section 1000, see Deed Book 468, Page 183 in the recorded plan above referred to.
