UNITRACT TO SUBDIVADE AND SELL

We, the undersigned clinton Abraham and wife jointly and severally in consideration of the benefits accruing to us from the increase in value of our property agree by this contract to appoint and do hereby appoint Mr. G. M. Moore of Greenville, S. C. as our exclusive agent to employ an engineer to survey our home place and divide the same into streets, blocks and lots and to sell the lots ecclusively to negro people, all at his own expense and profit. It is understood that the price which shall be paid us for the property shall be \$150 per lot net to us and that we shall give no deed to any lot until the price of \$150 is paid to us in full for said lot, after which we agree to make a deed direct to the party buying the particular lot. While the entire tract of land shall be divided and plated in lots and streets, it is hereby agreed that clinton Abraham and wife may reserve and refuse to sell whatever lots they may want to keep for a home place, provided these lots are so designated on the plat.

It is further agreed and understood that the number of lots, the resale price per lot and terms of payment for each lot shall be determined by G. M. Moore based upon the realestate market at the time the resale contract is made and that the profits above 3150 per lot shall go to G. M. Moore for development expense and his personal use. The tract of land referred to above represents forty eight acres, more or less, on the South side of the Whitehorse road and the West side of the Augusta road at the junction of these two roads in Greenville County, South Carolina:

It is agreed that if there should be any differences in the interpretation of this contract, the same shall be referred to arbitration and that Richard Lang shall be chairman of a board of three members.

This contract shall continue until all lots are sold and
