E. B. Willis, Jr., his heirs and assigns:

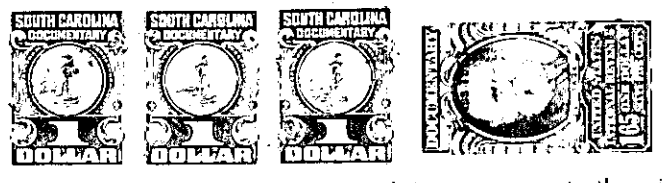

Office for Greenville County, South Carolina, in Plat Book P, at page 114, and having, according to a revision of the said plat, not yet recorded and made in January 1953, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:
