# CERTIFICATE of OWNERSHIP

heirs and assigns for interment purposes only, subject to the conditions, reservations and restrictions hereinafter contained, the following property situated in the Woodlawn Memorial Park, in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, described as Graves 3 & 4 Lot No. 287 in Section "K" according to a map of the said Woodlawn Memorial Park filed in the Office of the Woodlawn Memorial Park of said Greenville County, South Carolina.

That This Conveyance, and all right, title and interest hereby conveyed in the property above described, is, and at all times shall be, limited to a right of interment only therein, and is subject at all times to the rules and regulations and by-laws of said Corporation, on file in its office, now existing and/or which may be by it hereafter adopted either by amendment, alteration or the adoption of new ones, and which are specifically referred to and herein inserted as if set forth in full; all of which are conditions, reservations and restrictions, and are binding upon the Grantee, his heirs, devisees, executors, administrators and assigns.

Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to restrict the use of any other portion of said Cemetery. Only the Grantor or its successors, in interest of the fee title may enforce any restrictions heretofore or hereafter placed upon the use of any portion or section of said Cemetery.
