All our undivided interest in all that lot in the city of Greenville, South Carolina on the south side of Pearl Avenue being designated as lot No. 8 of Block E, Chapin Springs Land Company property as shown on a plat made by R. E. Dalton, May 7, 1917 and recorded in Plat Book E at Page 41 in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County and having the following metes and bounds:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the south side of Pearl Avenue, corner of Lot No. 7 and thence running with the line of that lot S. 2-30 E. 141.6 feet to an iron pin in the line of Lot No. 15; thence with the line of Lot No. 15 and continuing with the line of lot No. 14 N. 86-17 E. 50 feet to an iron pin at the corner of Lot No. 9; thence with the line of that lot N. 2-30 W. 139.6 feet to the south side of Pearl Avenue; thence along the line of Pearl Avenue S. 88-44 W. 50 feet to the beginning corner.
