CHARTER 895
BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS, GEORGE K. WASHBURN AND JOHN O. HUNT
both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 19th. day of August, 19 53, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration,
signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is
SOUTHERN LOOM DEVELOPMENT COMPANY

THIRD: That the principal place of business is
GREENVILLE, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to design, develop,
manufacture and sell looms and textile machinery, equipment and parts;
to design, patent, develop, sell and generally deal in textile and
other products of every kind and description made or processed from
natural and/or synthetic fibers, staples, yarns, filaments, materials
and substances of every kind and nature and articles, products and
mixtures made, blended or prepared therefrom; the right to construct,
maintain and operate plants for the conduct of such business and to have
any and all other rights and powers which may be necessary or incident
to the proper conduct of such business.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is One Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$150,000.00) dollars,
payable Twenty (20%) Cash, balance at the call of the directors.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Fifteen Hundred (1,500)
of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) - - - - - Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 17th. day of
August, 19 53, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the follow-
ing were elected directors:
John O. Hunt, G. K. Washburn, and Yvonne B. Hunt

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President, John O. Hunt
as Vice-President, G. K. Washburn ; as Secretary, G. K. Washburn
as Treasurer, Yvonne B. Hunt

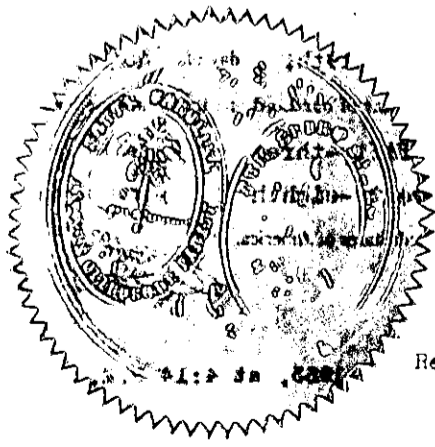
NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1912, and all amendments
thereto have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by
bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice
of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville-Piedmont
a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, O. FRANK THORNTON, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the
aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of
South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to
commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the
Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
