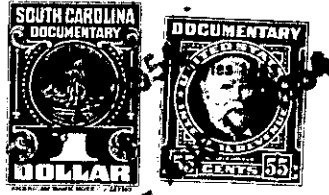

County, State of South Carolina, on the West side of U. S. Highway No. 29, and known and designated as Lots Nos. Fourteen (14), Fifteen (15), Sixteen (16), and Seventeen (17), of the T. D. Bennett Sub-division, as shown by plat made by G. Sam Lowe, Registered C. E., dated August 24, 1948, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book S, at page 143, and according to said plat, more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at a stake on the western side of Highway No. 29, joint corners of Lots Nos. 13 and 14; thence N. 4-05, W. 100 feet to joint front corners of lots Nos. 17 and 13; thence S. 88-45 W. with the joint line of lots Nos. 17 and 18, 203.5 feet to joint rear corners of Lots Nos. 17 and 13; thence S. 4-30 E. 100 feet to the joint rear corners of Lots Nos. 13 and 14; thence N. 85-45 E. 202.7 feet to the beginning corner.
