presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said... J. C. Hardin, his heirs and  
assigns, forever,

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Cleveland Township, Greenville  
County, State of South Carolina, containing 14 acres more or less, and having  
according to a survey of A. L. Hardin made in October, 1905, the  
following metes and bounds:

BEGINNING near an old ford on the East side of Matthew's  
Creek on a stake at the edge of the bank near an old fence XO W.  
35Ne 8 chains to a rock or chestnut witness at field; thence 50  
Se 20 chains to rock near road at lower end field; thence 35 Sw  
6 chains to stake on bank of Matthew's Creek; thence up creek about  
50 Nw 20 chains to the point of beginning, bounded by lands of W. E.  
Hardin, Matthew's Creek and lands of R. E. Johnston.
