interest in the following described
property to wit:-

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in *Glossy Mt,* Township, *Greenville*
County, State of South Carolina, *beginning at a rock corner of*
George Barton and Sudduth, running N. 11° 33' W.
940 ft. to a sweet gum at head of gully thence
N. 40° 40' E. 522 ft. to a rock ^{on old road} or oak, thence N. 41° 15' W.
2780 ft. more or less through gap of mt. to a stake
in ivy thicket west of old school path corner
of Sudduth and Bates thence N. 86° E. 1056 ft. to
lowest stake on top of mt, thence S. 78° 15' E. 2970 ft.
to head of branch and down said branch to
a bend in branch, thence S. 66° 15' E. 330 ft. to a stake
on bank of branch corner of Bates and Pitman
thence S. 4 W. 759 ft. to a hickory, thence S. 58 W. 330 ft.
to a rock oak gone, thence S. 78 E. 924 ft. to ash stump
near creek corner of Bates and Bates, thence S. 69 W. 2673 ft.
to the beginning corner containing 183 acres
