KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS. That We, Harold E. & Lottie H. Robinson, in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Three Thousand Five Hundred and no/100 ( 3500.00 ) Dollars to us, Harold E. & Lottie H. Robinson, in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Henry Burns, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Henry Burns, his heirs and assigns forever,

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Bates Township, Greenville, County, State of South Carolina, on the Southwest side of Third street (formerly Lindburg Street), known and designated as lot No. 4 of Block E. as shown on plat of the Village of S. Slater & Sons, Inc. recorded in the R. S. C. office for Greenville County in Plat Book K. at pages 63, 64 and 65, and having according to said plat the following metes and bounds, to wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the Southwest side of Third street, 20 feet from Edison street, joint corner of lots 4 and 5 of Block E., and running thence with the line of lot No. 5 S. 82-39 W. 124 feet to an iron pin; thence with the line of lots Nos. 7 & 8 S. 7-19 E. 70 feet to iron pin, joint rear corner of lots 3 and 4 of Block E.; thence with the line of lot No 3 E. 82-39 W. 124 feet to iron pin on the Southwest side of Third Street; thence with Third Street N. 7-19 E. 70 feet to the point of beginning.

The above described land is all of the same conveyed to me by James S. Benson on the day of January 19 43, deed recorded in office Register of Mesne Conveyance for Greenville County, in Book 555 Page 5.
