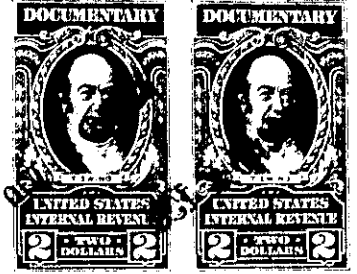
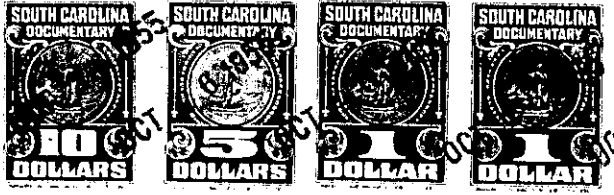

with improvements thereon  
all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Glassy Mountain Township, Greenville  
County, State of South Carolina

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the southwestern side of Highway #176 leading from Tryon to Landrum which iron pin is 268.9' from an iron pin on the southwestern side of said highway on the North Carolina-South Carolina State line and running thence along the southwestern side of said highway three calls as follows: S46°E 10.1'; S43°30'E 35'; and S43°01'E 30' to an iron pin; thence leaving said highway S46°51'W 86.1' to an iron pin on the northern bank of a small stream; thence on the northern bank of said stream N52°45'W 75.8' to an iron pin; thence N46° 42'E passing an iron pin at 62'ft. 98.1' to the point of BEGINNING.
