

Bellew's Mill Creek; thence down said creek (which separates the land hereby conveyed from the Bowder land) following the meanders thereof about 33.00 chains to the beginning corner.

(37) That tract in Glassy Mountain Township on North Saluda River, containing 200 acres, more or less, bounded by lands now or formerly of James Gosnell, John H. Goodwin, D. W. Howard, Ed Turner, et al, being the same property conveyed to R.E. Johnston by Deed recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, S.C., in Deed Volume NNN, at page 153.

(38) That tract of land containing 50 acres, more or less, lying and being in Greenville County, S.C., and known as a part of the Jeff Barton land and adjoining lands of, now or formerly, Peter Lindsey, Thomas Lindsey and others, and being the same tract of land conveyed to R. E. Johnston by Deed dated June 20, 1905, and recorded in Deed Book 000, at page 329.

(39) All that tract in Glassy Mountain Township, on the head waters of Vaughn's Creek of South Pacolet River, containing 208 acres, more or less, and described as follows:

BEGINNING on a pine and running thence southeast to a maple; thence east to a chestnut; thence southwest to a pine on the Old Bolton line; thence with the said line to a pine; thence north to a chestnut; thence north to the beginning corner.

(40) That tract in Glassy Mountain Township near Vaughn's Gap on the head waters of North Saluda River, containing 106 acres, more or less, having the following metes and bounds, according to a plat thereof prepared by Will D. Neves, Surveyor, bearing date August 3, 1904, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a poplar 3xom and running thence S. $2\frac{1}{2}$ W. along line of W.C. Lindsay land 39.00 chains to a stake 3xom; thence N. $61\frac{1}{2}$ E. 10.00 chains to a hickory 3xom; thence S. $60\frac{1}{2}$ E. 14.00 chains to a chestnut 3xom; thence N. $56\frac{1}{2}$ E. 24.00 chains to a forked chestnut in place of a hickory; thence S. $78\frac{1}{2}$ E. 5.00 chains to a Spanish oak (gone) 3xom; thence N. $78\frac{1}{2}$ E. 9.00 chains to a pine 3xom; thence N, $11-\frac{3}{4}$ W. along the line of the Covan Mills land 18.00 chains to a pine 3xom; thence N. $87\frac{1}{2}$ W. 7.50 chains to a chestnut 3xom; thence S. 80 W. 36.50 chains to the beginning corner.
