CHARTER BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

RECEIVED GREENVILLE COUNTY S.C. FEB 1 4 14 PM 1956 H.M.C.

WHEREAS, JACK D. TUCKER and JAMES N. LONG both of Greenville, South Carolina

did on the 26th day of January, 1956 file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is JACK D. TUCKER PLUMBING COMPANY, INC.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is general contracting of plumbing and heating; the installation of plumbing and heating equipment, repairing and servicing and all other things generally done in a general plumbing business.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars payable One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars paid in and One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars subscribed

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Two Hundred (200) of the par value of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 6th day of January, 1956, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: Jack D. Tucker and James N. Long

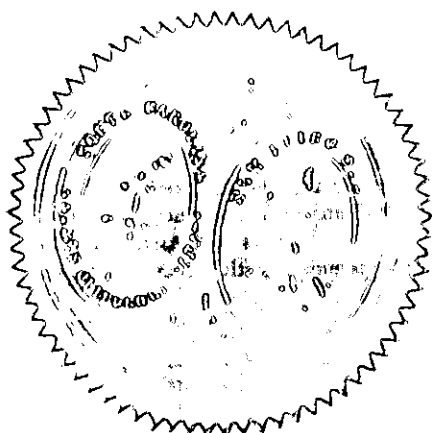
EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President, Jack D. Tucker as Vice-President, James N. Long as Secretary, James N. Long as Treasurer, Jack D. Tucker

NINTH: That all requirements of Title 12, Article 1, Chapter 2, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1952, and all amendments thereto have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville Piedmont a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, O. FRANK THORNTON, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
